


HERBAL STRING


1 the connecting ecotone

In ecology, an ecotone is defined as a transition zone between different ecosystems. Establishing a herbaceous fringe as an ecotone connects not only habitats but also bordering landscape elements.

A herbal string weaves the landscape patches together.




The designidea of the connecting ecotone

siteplan I M 1:2000




The current zoning of the surrounding area and the development from a separating green space to a connecting ecotone

2 design and development process


#1 make space,

plant trees and shrubs




#3 allow the herbaceous

3 the productive ecotone

As a transitional area, the ecotone contributes to greater biodiversity, promotes soil formation through nutrient production, and its natural water cycle provides a cool environment in times of climate crisis and enables photosynthesis in plants, thus contributing to fresh air. Not only for biodiversity itself, but also for the people living and working in the neighboring residential and industrial areas.
